As a nonprofit healthcare organization, Tanner does this while receiving no local tax dollars and reinvests revenues back into new technologies, facilities and the provision of charity care.

or some, it's the comfort of having 24-hour emergency care available close by. For others, it's lifesaving treatment for cancer and heart disease. Tanner is X-rays, doctor visits, lab tests, health fairs and more.

But for more than 2,600 area residents, Tanner is jobs. In fact, Tanner Health System is one of the largest employers in Carroll County.

According to figures from the Georgia Hospital Association (GHA), Tanner's economic impact in west Georgia and east Alabama is approximately \$450 million. By using local services from area companies, Tanner helps create employment

### Wellness Is Key to Our Mission

Wellness takes many forms, from providing health education in a variety of ways to offering free screenings. Tanner works every day to improve the health of the communities we serve. During the past year:

**6,309** people attended programs on a variety of topics offered through the Tanner Speakers Bureau.

1,007 pre-K children throughout the region received free vision screenings.

**1,542** people participated in walking programs, earning incentives while improving their health.

**19** episodes of *NewsTalk* AM 1330, WLBB's Community Voice program, featured Tanner physicians and other healthcare professionals who provide health education to the community.

100 community members attended monthly State of the Heart sessions. hosted by Tanner Heart & Vascular Specialists.

# Most Advanced Cancer Treatment Now Available

he 2009-2010 fiscal year at Tanner began with a single, tiny, high-intensity beam of radiation, carefully and precisely focused on a patient's cancer and emitted from the most advanced, proven radiation therapy delivery system available.

On July 1, 2009 — the first day of the fiscal year that ran through June 30, 2010 — Tanner's Roy Richards, Sr. Cancer Center marked the completion of a \$5.6 million, 4,000-square-foot expansion by providing the first treatment on its new Varian Trilogy with RapidArc linear accelerator. With this new piece of technology, the Roy Richards, Sr. Cancer Center provides the most advanced radiotherapy techniques while using the most clinically efficient processes available.

This new technology puts Tanner's cancer services on par with any program anywhere in the world, providing area residents with access to state-of-the-art cancer treatment options right here in their own community.

When the cancer center opened a little more than 20 years ago, the then-Tanner Radiation Center performed 4,130 radiation therapy treatments. This year, with the Varian Trilogy doubling the center's external beam radiotherapy capacity and a broader range of radiation treatments available, the Roy Richards, Sr. Cancer Center performed 10,350 radiation treatments and almost 3,000 infusion treatments for patients who needed chemotherapy.

It is part of Tanner's commitment to the people who trust Tanner with their health.

# Tanner Hospice Care: Continuing a Noble Mission



# Tanner Hospitals Place on GHA Quality Honor Roll



Tanner Medical Center/Carrollton, Tanner Medical Center/Villa Rica and Higgins General Hospital in Bremen were each named to the Georgia Hospital Association's Partnership for Health and Accountability Quality Honor Roll. They were among just 48 hospitals in Georgia to be placed in the Presidential category for quality.

n the fall of 2009, communities throughout the country found themselves struggling to respond to the threat of the H1N1 influenza virus.

At Tanner, the response to the novel strain of flu was swift. First, Tanner launched a special Web site, kept current by Laura Larson, MD, medical director of infection prevention, to provide the latest and most accurate information on the spread and risk of the H1N1 flu virus. The site included answers to frequently asked questions, information on the spread of the virus, tips for caring for the sick and more.

Then, Tanner hosted a regional summit, inviting community partners from area school systems, civic leaders, emergency responders, medical professionals and others who could be significantly impacted by the flu. The summit provided an opportunity for participants to question a panel of medical experts and learn more about Tanner's prepared response to the virus.

Less than a month later, Tanner established regional H1N1 vaccination centers in Carrollton, Villa Rica and Bremen to provide free H1N1 vaccines throughout the region. In the end, more than 2,400 people received free H1N1 vaccines from Tanner.

# 'Take a Step Toward Better Health' Helps Find PAD in the Community

ore than 12 million Americans live with a disease that can cause leg cramps, leg fatigue, leg pain and a host of other symptoms, but that often causes no symptoms at all.

To help area residents who could be at risk for peripheral artery disease (PAD) learn whether they have the disease and get physicianguided information on their treatment options, Tanner hosted a series of free PAD screening events in communities throughout west Georgia and east Alabama.

More than 800 people were screened. Of those screened, more than 400 needed medical follow-up or further evaluation.

The "Take a Step Toward Better Health" initiative utilized a simple test called an ankle brachial index, or ABI, that allows a physician to compare blood pressure readings taken at the ankle to readings taken

at the arm. A lower reading in a leg can indicate reduced blood flow caused by PAD and the possibility that the leg may have a blocked artery. Untreated, the disease can cause the tissues in the affected limb to die due to a lack of oxygen — a condition called gangrene. If allowed to progress to this point, a person with PAD faces the risk of amputation of the affected limb.

More common, though, is the risk of heart attack and stroke. If

arteries in the legs or arms become blocked, there's a very good chance that an artery feeding the heart or brain could also become blocked. Early detection allows physicians the opportunity to prescribe interventions and therapies that can reduce the risk for heart attack and stroke.

### Tanner Makes the List

Each year, the *Atlanta Business Chronicle* releases its "Book of Lists," chronicling metro Atlanta's top performers in a range of industries, including real estate, education, finance, human resources, hospitality and health care.

As it has been in the past, Tanner was very well represented, making the list for every area in which the organization was eligible.

Among Atlanta's Top 25 hospitals, Tanner Medical Center/Carrollton ranked 13th, up from 15th the previous year. Tanner President and CEO Loy M. Howard earned a mention as a "List Maker" for his leadership of Tanner, and

was included in the *Atlanta Business Chronicle's* "Who's Who in Health Care" as one of the top 100 people who lead the region's healthcare industry.

Tanner Medical Group, which had not been ranked the previous year, was No. 14 among Atlanta's Top 25 Physician Group Practices. The rankings for this list were determined by the number of physicians in the group.

Also ranked in the "Book of Lists" was Tanner Home Health, which placed fifth among Atlanta's Top 10 Home Health Agencies based on the number of patients served in metro Atlanta.

illowbrooke at Tanner, the behavioral health service for Tanner Health System, has continued to serve a tremendous community need since opening its new inpatient behavioral health unit and outpatient treatment center in Villa Rica last year.

With 2,357 admissions to its 52-bed inpatient behavioral health facility, Willowbrooke at Tanner allowed more people to get back to healthy lives closer to home, so their loved ones could take an active role in their recovery and aftercare.

Almost 130 families benefited from inhome therapy through Willowbrooke at Tanner's Intensive Family Intervention Program (TIFIP), while 353 adults and 663 children and adolescents received care through the Tanner Center for Behavioral Health's outpatient partial hospitalization programs.

# Beauty and Healing

With the completion of the Willowbrooke at Tanner inpatient unit in Villa Rica, Tanner Health System has provided a way for more people — including adults, elder adults, children and adolescents — to receive quality inpatient behavioral health services right in their own community.

Healing aspects of the new facility include private enclosed courtyards where patients can enjoy the open air and participate in horticulture therapy.

Now, thanks to a generous gift from Tanner Medical Foundation donors Clarence and Helen Finleyson, the walls of the courtyards are adorned with beautiful murals. Local artist Melissa Crawford painted the murals, which she based on impressions she received while visiting Monet's garden in France.

"Tanner Health System has been on the leading edge for delivery of medical services to west Georgia and east Alabama for many years," says Clarence Finleyson. "As the first new inpatient behavioral health facility built in Georgia in at least 20 years, Willowbrooke at Tanner exemplifies these efforts and results."

#### **Tanner Medical Center/Carrollton**

At Tanner Medical Center/Carrollton, this commitment to the future is being cemented in brick, steel and mortar. Work on a new emergency department and expanded surgical services center is under way, joining already new and expanded facilities at Tanner Medical Center/Villa Rica and Higgins General Hospital in Bremen.

The new emergency department at

Tanner Medical Center/Carrollton will almost double the hospital's emergency services capacity from 22 to 40 beds. A new state-of-the-art design maximizes efficiency and patient comfort, while new trauma rooms and a new area for minor emergencies ensure that patients are receiving the right care, quickly.

The department will grow from its present 10,000 square feet to 32,000 square feet, and will incorporate a range of in-department diagnostic imaging  $\,$ 

services, including computed tomography (CT), ultrasound and digital X-ray.

In addition to the new emergency department, Tanner Medical Center/Carrollton is also expanding its surgical services unit from seven to 10 operating suites, including a new hybrid operating suite that doubles as a catheterization lab for the latest vascular procedures.

The new OR suites will feature the latest healthcare design elements, including HD screens for minimally invasive laparoscopic procedures, integrated anesthesia equipment

and more. Each of the new operating suites will be more than 550 square feet in size, ensuring plenty of space for each patient care team to operate efficiently.

The hospital's shortstay surgery unit will grow from 16 to 23 rooms, allowing more access to

same-day surgical procedures that now account for up to 90 percent of all surgical cases at Tanner. The number of suites for gastroenterology procedures — such as colonoscopies — will grow from two to three.

Loved ones and caregivers will enjoy expanded waiting rooms and family consultation spaces, as well as areas equipped with digital patient/community education screens and more.

This expansion continues a vision for Tanner Medical Center/ Carrollton that began with the construction of the Tanner Heart and Vascular Center and the Health Education and Wellness Learning Center, both of which opened on the hospital campus in 2008. Once complete, patients at Tanner Medical Center/ Carrollton will have access to more parking and a greater range of services in new, more comfortable facilities. The expansion is expected to be complete in 2012.

#### **Tanner Medical Center/Villa Rica**

Since opening in its new hospital facility in 2003, Tanner Medical Center/Villa Rica has been serving an ever-greater demand for healthcare services. A growing number of local providers and an increasing number of births, surgeries, diagnostic imaging procedures and more at the hospital make future expansion of Tanner Medical Center/Villa Rica's facilities inevitable.

Tanner is working with architecture firms to evaluate the addition of a planned fourth level to the hospital, increasing bed space for the hospital's maternity services and inpatient care.

Tanner has also purchased more than 11 acres adjacent to the hospital campus to provide space for this additional growth, providing access to more services and improved facilities in the Villa Rica community.

#### **Higgins General Hospital in Bremen**

This year, Higgins General Hospital in Bremen went nuclear. With nuclear medicine services now available at Higgins General Hospital, residents from across Haralson County and west Georgia have access to an increased range of diagnostic imaging services — including full-time MRI, ultrasound, X-ray and mammography services — in Bremen.

Efforts are under way to bring still more providers and services to the hospital, which experienced tremendous growth after becoming part of the Tanner system. This expansion of services will eventually necessitate the construction of a second medical office building on or near the Higgins General Hospital campus.

#### Willowbrooke at Tanner

Additional staff will continue to be added to this new facility, enabling it to fully realize its potential to touch thousands of lives with quality inpatient and outpatient behavioral health services.

Willowbrooke at Tanner plans to begin serving more hospital emergency departments in the coming years, furthering its regional impact. The program is also developing a mind and memory clinic with the latest technology to understand psychological conditions and provide patients the tools to understand and control them.
